BUILDING COMMITTEE UPDATE – DECEMBER 8, 2019

Within the last few weeks the crew from *Vision* Contracting, and Brian from *Audio Plus*, have meticulously been working on many different aspects of the current renovation. In this time the following has been completed:

- Framed and hung 1 fire door and 1 standard door
- Framed and covered extended stage
- Extended stage stairs
- Addition of stairs to back stage door exits
- Casing around attic door
- Trim along new front wall
- Modified front of stage to incorporate subwoofer
- Drywalled new front wall
- Drywalled back hallway behind front stage
- Primed front and back wall
- Painted back wall, including around elevator and brick accents
- Painted back hallway behind front stage
- Sanded wood walls and ceilings, including front arc
- Stain matched wood on walls and ceiling
- Repaired and added new electrical in office
- Installed new wiring for audio equipment

Renovation will continue, with the following to be completed:

- Painting and staining
- · Electrical for audio visual
- Placement and installation of screen
- Placement and installation of projector
- · Placement and installation of stage lighting
- Testing of audio visual equipment
- Placement and installation of cross
- Replacement of Carpeting
- Clean up
